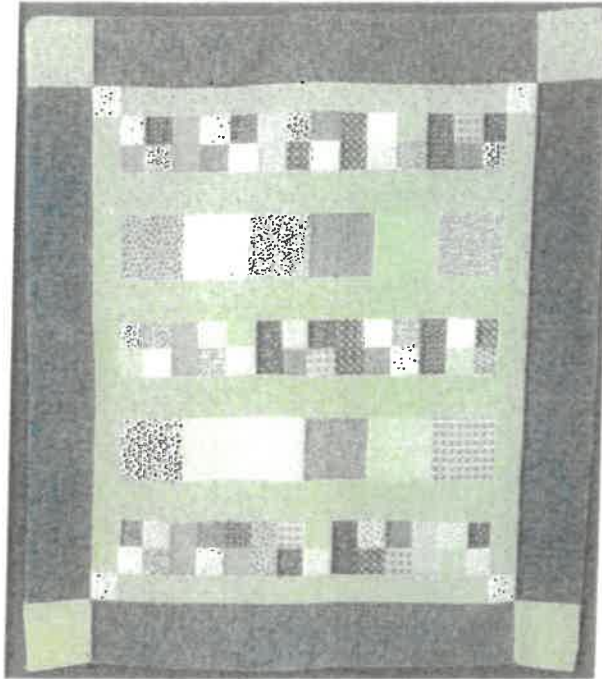




## Geometry Quilt using Precuts



Approx. finished size: 45" by 50"

### **Fabrics requirements:**

40 x 5" squares - (these could of course come from a layer cake)

Sashing: 50cm

Border 1 – 30cm

Border 2- 60cm

Quantities based on fabric 112cm wide (42")

### **Workshop Notes**

#### **Row 1, 3 and 5**

Create the 4-patch first from a series of 2.5" squares cut from your 5" squares

You will need 5 of these per row (15 for this quilt)

Add a rectangle piece next to 4 of them, which has been cut 2.5" x 4.5"

Sew all the blocks together making sure you have a four patch at the start and end of each row.

#### **Rows 2 and 4**

Sew together six 5" squares.

#### **Sashing and Border**

Cut 4 strips of sashing 3½" wide and sew between the rows.

Then cut 4 strips of border 1 (we used same fabric as the sashing) 2½" wide and sew to both sides of the quilt then to the top and bottom – the cornerstones are optional.

Finally cut strips 5" wide for border 2, again adding optional cornerstones.

Layer, quilt and bind using your preferred methods.

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
